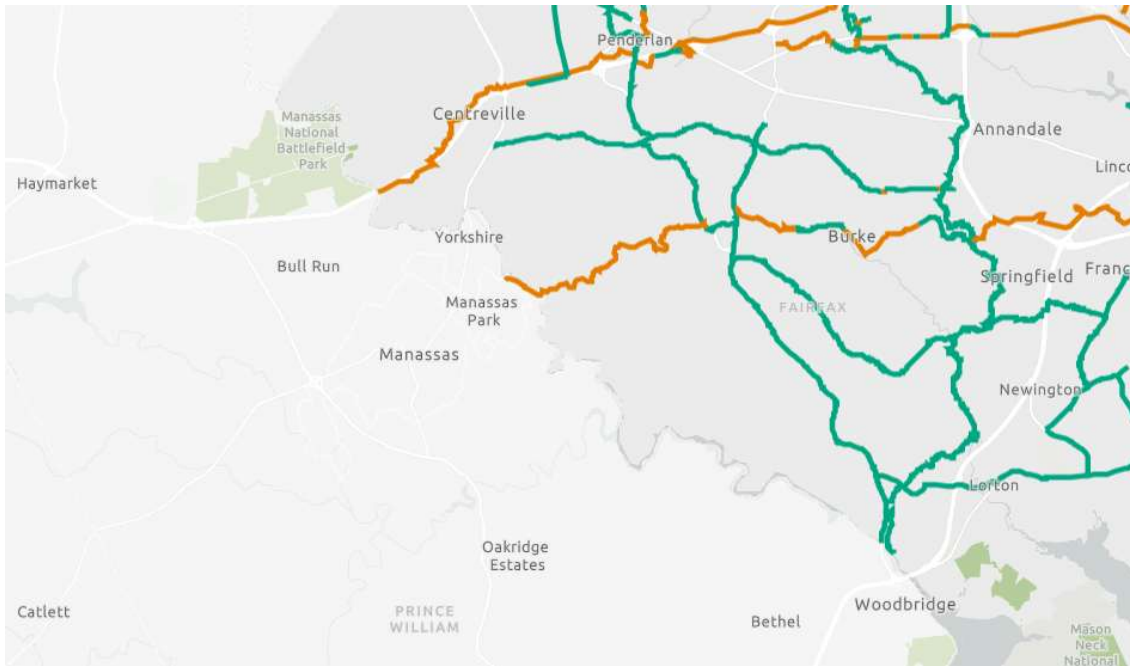

Trails Funding in Prince William County CIP

The draft FY24 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) proposes to spend all the remaining 2019 bond funding identified for parks and trails.

Spending planned for next year (FY24 starts July 1, 2023) includes \$9 million for Powells Creek Crossing, \$4.5 million for Occoquan Greenway construction, and \$500,000 for Neabsco Greenway land acquisition.

Also included are:

- \$4 million for the North Woodbridge Pedestrian Bridge
- an increase of \$2 million for parks maintenance/accessibility projects, including trails

The 10-Year CIP Look-Ahead listed as the top item Parks, Recreation & Tourism Master Plan Implementation. In that plan, the answer to the question “*What park and recreation services are most valued in Prince William County?*” the #1 answer was “*Trails/Connectivity.*”

State of the Parks Event - March 2 (7:00-9:00pm)

This year, the county’s “department of fun” (Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism) is upscaling its annual report to the public. Anticipate a party atmosphere for the community conversation on March 2 at the Kelly Leadership Center, including a KidZone for childcare so adults can get up-to-speed on what's happening and what's planned.

This is a great opportunity for trails advocates to learn where 400 miles of new trails are planned in the 2040 Mobility Chapter.

Want to know what planned segments in your neighborhood are funded, and where you might want to speak to your elected officials so the county converts “planned” lines on paper (*OK, in a GIS geodatabase...*) into “real” on-the-ground trails? Show up on March 2 and ask.

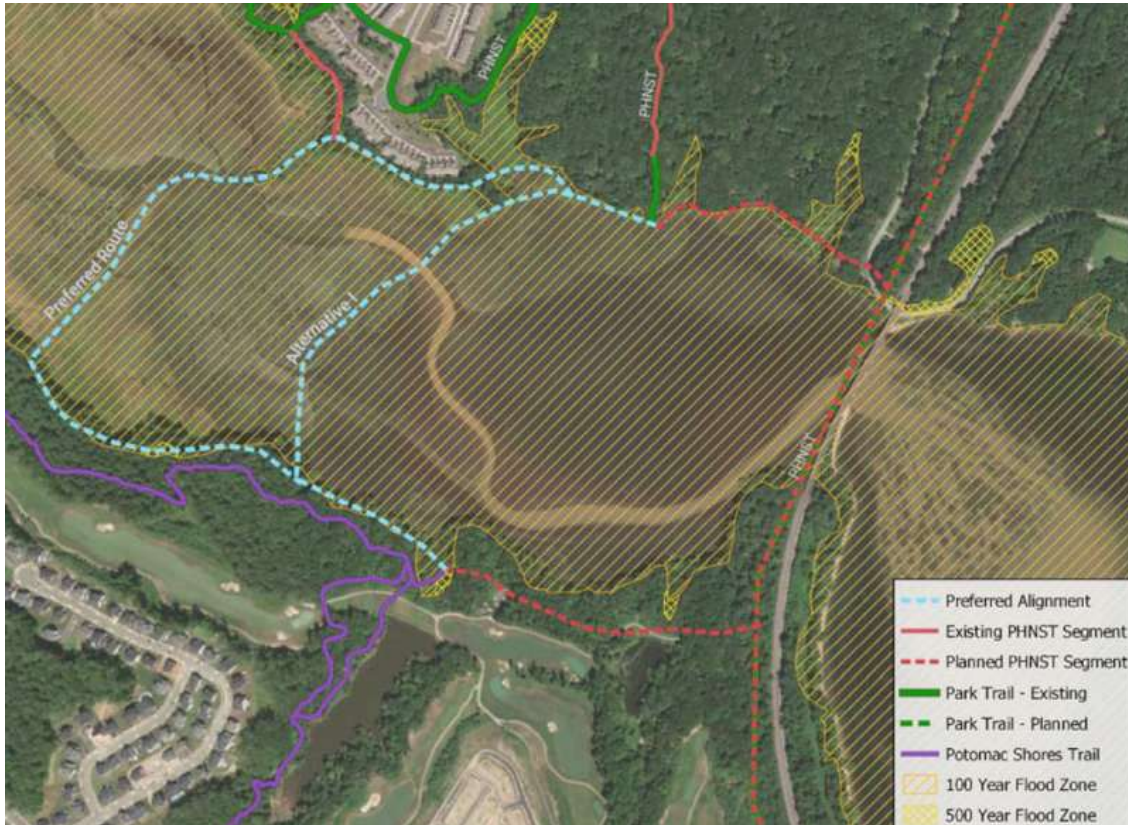

Greenways: Making Progress In A Forward Direction

Prince William County has advertised for *Architect/Engineering Design and Construction Administration Services for Potomac Heritage National Scenic Trail (PHNST) - Powells Creek Crossing*. Three design options for the project will be developed. The \$9 million project is funded through bonds approved by county voters in 2019.

Construction has begun of a bow truss bridge across Hedges Run for Occoquan Greenway. When completed, it will resemble the bridge shown below.
